If you need help registering, call Kitsap Public Health at 360-728-2235, Monday-Friday, 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. Testing is available from many other organizations in our community. Go to kcowa.us/covid19 for a list.

WHO CAN GET TESTED?

Testing is available for anyone who:

- Has any COVID-19 symptoms
- Has been in close contact with someone who tested positive for COVID-19.
- Meets other testing criteria recommended by Kitsap Public Health (see kcowa.us/covidtesting for details).

HOW MUCH DOES A TEST COST?

Testing is vailable at no cost to most participants:

- Your health insurance will be billed for the cost of the test. You could be billed if your insurance does not cover the test.
- If you do not have insurance, the cost of your test can be covered by a federal program.

HOW SOON WILL I GET RESULTS?

Results are typically available within 3-4 days.



COVID-19 SYMPTOMS INCLUDE:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea
